


<p>What are AP exams?</p> <p>AP Exams are administered by schools worldwide on set dates each May. Exams usually last around three hours. Each AP Exam usually consists of multiple-choice questions and free-response questions (essay, problem-solving, oral response).</p>	
<p>Why should I consider taking an AP exam?</p>	
<p>Reason #1: College Credit</p> <p>Almost all two- and four-year colleges and universities in the United States offer credit <u>and/or</u> advanced placement for qualifying AP Exam scores.</p> <p><u>Credit</u>: Students earn credit toward their college degrees.</p> <p><u>Advanced placement</u>: Students can skip introductory courses and move directly into higher-level classes, and/or fulfill general education requirements.</p>	<p>Information about AP credit and placement policies at many colleges and universities is available at: https://apstudent.collegeboard.org/creditandplacement/search-credit-policies</p> <p>AP Credit Policy Search</p> <p>Find colleges and universities that offer credit or placement for AP scores. <p>Reason #2: Increased College Success</p> <p>A recent study* showed that students who earned a 3, 4, or 5 on the AP Exam had higher first-year college grade point averages and were more likely to return for the second year of college than non-AP students of similar ability.</p>	<p>Reason #3: Save Money</p> <p>Students who take five years or more to graduate can spend \$8,000 to \$27,000 for each additional year in college.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The typical college cost per year for a four-year public institution is \$8,142 for in-state students and \$19,670 for out-of-state students.* • Students attending private institutions might expect to incur \$27,389 for each additional year it takes to earn a bachelor's degree.*
<p>How do I register for an AP exam?</p> <p>AP Exam fee for 2016 is \$93 per exam. Pick up a registration form at your school, fill it out, and return it to your school bookkeeper.</p> <p><i>Do you qualify for free or reduced priced lunch?</i> If you qualify for free or reduced priced lunch, you can take the AP exam for free due to a fee reduction from the College Board and a grant from the United Way of Central Iowa.</p> <p>You must register BEFORE March 27. This is the final deadline for signing up!</p> <p><i>*If you register for an exam, but don't show up on the exam date, you will be charged a \$15.00 unused test fee. This applies to <u>all</u> students, regardless of financial status.</i></p>	<p>How do I find out my AP exam scores?</p> <p>AP exams are taken in May and graded in June. Scores are reported online in July.</p> <p>AP exam scores are uploaded into Infinite Campus so you always have access to your assessment information.</p> <p>AP Exam scores are NOT a part of your school transcript.</p> <p>Unlike the ACT and SAT exam scores which are automatically reported to colleges and universities, <u>you decide</u> if and when you choose to report your AP exam score(s) to colleges and universities.</p>
